



Construction Update: Completed Work




Completed Retaining Wall December 2021

Work completed to date:

- MBTA Right of Way clearing
- Replaced stairs
- Built temporary platforms
- Installed New Retaining Wall
- Track and drainage improvements



Construction Update: Upcoming Work

Upcoming work to be completed:

- Installation of new elevators, ramps, and stairways
- Complete remaining highlevel platforms and canopies
- Streetscape improvements
- Replace pedestrian bridge



Updated Construction Schedule

Anticipated Completion of the Natick Center Station has been extended to Early 2024

This revised schedule reflects the project needs to address the following conditions:

- Soil conditions requiring upgraded retaining wall
- Supply chain delays on critical path items (platform materials, signals, etc.)
- Other associated COVID-19 delays



Natick Center Station will remain open throughout construction.


