


Total Public Transit Funding

1992 - 2022 (in 2022 Dollars)








2019 Farebox Revenue Recovery




Total Public Transit Operating Expenses

Biden Administration Proposals

- ✓ Authorize Large Public Transit Agencies to Use Urbanized Area Formula Grants for Operating Assistance in FY 2024 & FY 2025
 - Neither House nor Senate Transportation Appropriations Bills Include this Proposal
- Increase the Federal Share to 100 Percent for Mobility for Seniors/Persons with Disabilities Formula Grants and Rural Formula Grants in FY 2024 & 2025
 - Included in Senate Transportation Appropriations Bill




The APTA advocacy campaign—which included a digital media campaign and a customized bus wrap—launched in Washington, DC, during APTA's Legislative Conference.
