### **Goal of Pre-15% Design Phase Outreach**

- To help inform the preliminary design of the project, we invited residents, business owners, bus riders, and others along Blue Hill Ave to share their ideas and opinions about:
  - Bus stop locations
  - New crosswalks and other pedestrian and bicycle safety improvements
  - Parking and curb regulations
  - Opportunities for greenery, public art, seating, and other sidewalk amenities



### **Key Metrics**

- 24,585 print materials distributed
- 668 responses collected, including 26 in Haitian Creole and 16 in Spanish
  - 331 survey responses (print and digital)
  - 223 comments/dots on Open House maps
  - 114 responses on Youth Workshop map

Feedback analyzed included questions from survey (online and in-paper / paper responses) and map-based feedback from both the Open Houses and Youth Workshop.



#### Language Distribution of Survey **Respondents**




#### **Response Themes**

- 30% of all open-ended comments from the survey address bicycle infrastructure
  - Out of these comments, 82% expressed desire for safe, protected bike facilities
- 21% of comments call for safer pedestrian infrastructure
  - O Better crosswalks, more crosswalks, safer sidewalks, better pedestrian visibility
- Nearly 10% of comments specifically call for better traffic enforcement
  - Double parking, speeding, running red lights, and parking in bus stops
- Over 10% of comments called for specific street furniture/public realm enhancements
  - Greenery, more trash cans, frequent trash pickup, benches, better street lighting, public art






#### **Bus Stop Location Feedback: Fairway Street**

Notable comments shared about stop location:

- "it is NOT in a convenient location for the majority of users and families. It creates safety issues in reaching the stop by having to go across traffic when going in the opposite direction."
- "It is close to the Mattapan Trolley"
- "As long as there are signalized crossings across both sides of the street, this would be a great location, as it is in the heart of the square."
- "I would actually take the bus along the corridor if this was the stop configuration."
- "There is not enough seating, no shelter from inclement weather, solar powered phone charging stations."






#### **Bus Stop Feedback: Woodhaven St**

#### Notable comments shared about stop location:

- "I have friends that live on Woodhaven St that I often have to pickup or visit."
- "Major intersection (car wash, churches): It's close for residents and others who need access to this area"
- "Bus stop also should accommodate Early Childhood Center- too far"
- "Close to commuter rail."
- "Having a bus stop as close as possible to the Blue Hill Ave commuter rail station on the Fairmount Line is important for transfers. This should include layover space where 716 could stop to provide a direct commuter rail connection at the Fairmount Line Blue Hill Ave station."
- "Why not make the woodhaven stop closer to the commuter rail train station for ease of transfer."
- "Why is there no bus stop immediately connecting to the Fairmount line? These connections are important".






#### **Bus Stop Feedback: Walk Hill St**

Notable comments shared about stop location:

- "This meets the needs for those who patronize this area frequently."
- "Yes but no bus stop in the center of the ave"
- "Bus Stop necessary for Mattapan Library & nearby laundromat & businesses & residents"
- "Don't connect where I need to get to for childcare, work etc. already lost car lanes to bike lanes in American legion, now talking about removing cut through in Franklin park and trying to turn blue hill ave to bunny lanes. Please stop. None of those fit any of my needs and have increased traffic time and congestion immensely."




- "Morton is an important transfer location so being as close to Morton as possible is important"






- "The consistent double parking of large tractor trailer delivery trucks for the Happy Supermarket at Harvard Street (heading north) is infuriating and backs-up traffic on a daily basis during morning commute. Can we please include traffic enforcement as part of the redevelopment plan?"
- "There should be no bus stops in front of businesses . It should be parking spaces for that business.. ONLY IF NECESSARY a bus stop should be on front of a business."
- "Camera install along BHA corridors"
- "The double parking by the Sun Pizza / Happy Supermarket is some of the worst on the entire avenue. This HAS to be addressed in some capacity."





## **Bus Stop Feedback: American Legion Hwy**


- "Just pointing out that between Talbot Ave and American Legion Hwy is the Dorchester Immanuel Church of the Nazarene property I would like you to consider that 806 -810 Blue Hill Ave is the church property. (I suggest the bus stop be constructed north of the ALH intersection; Otherwise there will be some obstruction directly in front of the church .Recognizing the presence of the church at that location, I would object to a Center lane bus stop at ALH. This will create even more congestion than already happens at the ALH and BI Hill Ave intersection."
- "yes, if it is located just north of American Legion and the 14 bus stop is collocated in the same new stop on BHA"
- "Need at least two more stops added"


- "Harvard Street Health Center BH Ave/Old Street"

- "I am curious why there is no stop closer to the Columbia/Seaver/Franklin Park interchange. It seems like many people would use that stop since it connects multiple key bus routes and neighborhoods."
- "Bus stops should be located to minimize walking distance to the nearest route 29 bus stop for residents of locations such as Pasadena Rd and Normandy St, by being far side at the Seaver/ Blue Hill Ave intersection, and to make transfers between Blue Hill Ave buses and the route16 bus as convenient as possible by being located far side at the Columbia Rd intersection."





## Bus Stop Feedback: Nazing St / Pasadena Rd

- "only if you keep a station/stop at Grove Hall Mecca! super important destination, but you know that :)"
- "It's ok, though I would prefer if it were a little closer to Seaver St"
- "Why no stop at Seaver or the split with Warren?"
- "This intersection is where a lot of children cross for school. It is also near many senior citizen residents who do not feel comfortable walking out in the middle of the street for a bus. It is also near where cars turn from Seaver on to Blue Hill Ave"








## **Block by Block Feedback: Summary**


- The highest number of improvement responses were for the area along Blue Hill Ave between River Street and Regis Road (Mattapan Square)
- The lowest number of improvement responses per mile were for the area between Talbot Avenue and Glenway Street.
- "More Trees and Green Infrastructure" received the most responses, followed by "New Crosswalks."
- "New Blue Bike Station" and "Bike Racks" received the least responses.
- Responses normalized by mile.





# Next Steps for Design

- Looking to apply feedback re: new crosswalks, benches, bike racks, new trees, etc. wherever possible.
- Parking: looking to retain as much parking as possible in areas like Talbot Ave, where respondents cited chronic double-parking.
- Bus Stops:
  - As per feedback, exploring platform layouts between Walk Hill and Morton St that balance parking demand and Morton St (Route 21) transfers
  - As per feedback, looking into better connections to Fairmount Line station for Woodhaven St stop and improved connections to Fremont St (+ better access to Ellison Parks Early Childhood Center)
- Multiple sections where respondents expressed desire for multiple improvements that will have trade-offs due to space limitations (For instance, parking vs. sidewalk vs. trees / green infrastructure). Outreach during 15% phase and subsequent phases will ask community members to weigh-in on trade-offs.
